

Toyohiko Kagawa 1888~1960


The works, which Toyohiko Kagawa and his companions did between 1909-1923, which started from community welfare to support people's everyday life, became the roots of co-operative movement, labor movement, peasant movement, peace movement etc. Toyohiko Kagawa devoted his life to the deprived or suffering people.

These activities did not remain only in Kobe but spread all over Japan after the Great Kanto Earthquake. This helped to build up the bases of action for welfare, education, medicine, products, labor, co-operatives, peace, human rights and co-living.



Kagawa Memorial Hall was built as a community center to do various activities: ie. General Laboratory (for study, investigation and developing programs), Museum and Archives, Youjien (nursery school), Café Lounge e, etc. which are supported by the Church as a place to practice and experience together as one.
